When you ask for help from a Stephen Minister, a Stephen Leader will contact you to talk more about Stephen Ministry and what it can mean to you. If your needs can be best served by a Stephen Minister, you will be matched with someone who will support you through a tough time.

Confidentiality is a top priority for Stephen Ministers. You do not need to be concerned that other people will discover what you talk about with your Stephen Minister. In addition, this is a free service.

When do we need God's love most? Of course we need that love every second of our lives. But at times God's love is especially precious to us... times when we lose a loved one, or when life becomes so confusing that we do not know where to turn, or when life just becomes meaningless.


Deacon Slate Confirmation Vote: Donald Gruel, Church Moderator

On Sunday, July 19, church members will have the opportunity to vote for the deacon slate for the upcoming year. This slate includes Huett Bishop, Rebecca Cooper (one year term), Katie Howell, John Lesesne, Doug Moss, and Mary Rich. Discussions have taken place as to how best to vote, and it has been determined that since there is a slate of 6 to fill 6 vacancies that the vote will take place by acclamation and not a paper ballot. At the end of both the 9:00 am and 11:00 am worship service, a special called business meeting will take place in which eligible voting members (age 18 and over) will cast a yes vote or no vote by the uplifted hand. We do not want to exclude those members that are unable to attend or feel more comfortable worshiping from home from voting. Therefore, we will waive the requirement that a member must be in attendance to cast a vote. Members unable to attend the service on Sunday, July 19 will have until 5:00 PM on Tuesday, July 21 to call the church office (843-524-3197) to register a yes or no vote. Please note that you will need to give your name so that we can confirm that you are eligible to vote. Thank you for your understanding as we continue to navigate this season.


