To follow our pandemic guidelines for in-person gatherings and try to be as safe and responsible as possible, please do not bring flowers to decorate the cross on Easter Sunday this year. We want to avoid large groups gathering and removing facemasks for pictures with families and friends. Thank you for understanding and showing your concern for other people by adhering to our in-person gathering guidelines. We will look forward to the return of this tradition next year.

Plan to join us at 9:00 am or 11:00 am in the Sanctuary for Worship on Resurrection Sunday! Sign-ups are required for these services. The sign-up link will open on Monday, March 29. Guidelines for in-person gatherings will be followed, so facemasks and social distancing are necessary. Extended Teaching Care will be available for bed-babies through Kindergarten for both services but remember to sign-up for child-care. The 11:00 am service will be available on Facebook Livestream beginning at 10:50 am.
