Endowment

Did you know the BCOB had endowments established in 2014 to support funding for missions and preservation of our historic structures? We currently have approximately \$400,000 invested with The South Carolina Baptist Foundation to manage those funds. We also have bequests, or future estate giving promises, of a little over \$2 million. If we can grow our endowments to \$5 million in managed funds, our church could be the beneficiary of over \$200,000 per year that will be over and above our budget offerings. What a blessing that would be for generations of BCOB members to come!

There are currently over 50 cremain plots along the Newcastle St. fence line that can accommodate one or two cremain urns (\$800 each), and a limited number of single casket burial lots that can accommodate a single casket (\$1200).
