## **Ministerial Staff Transitions**

At our most recent Town Hall, I offered an update on staff roles and responsibilities. I would like to share those updates with those were unable to attend the meeting. As the Associate Pastor, Jeff's roles and responsibilities shifted over the years he was here. When he left in July, Jeff was responsible for pastoral care and ministry to senior adults. Jeff had also inherited most of the administrative responsibilities of staff. Considering current ministry needs and future ministry opportunities, we decided not to begin the process of hiring another associate pastor. To address the need for pastoral care, the church voted to hire Mike Brainard as the Interim Minister of Pastoral Care. Sensing God stirring in her life, Missy Smith, our current Minister of Youth and Communication, has felt a call to transition to a new role where she will be responsible for Adult Ministry (Young, Median, and Senior Adults) and Missions. This transition will not take place until sometime next year. The Nominating Committee has just begun the process of putting together a search committee for a Minister of Youth and Communication. The Personnel Committee and staff are currently discerning how to best address our church administration needs. I ask that you pray for the church as we navigate the season ahead.

#### **Stewardship Update**

Because we have not shared a financial update in the past two months, we want to make sure to highlight a few things that are not reflected in these numbers.

- We have nearly met our goal for our Windows Campaign! Of the \$193,000 that was needed we have collected just over \$189,000. Anything we collect above \$193,000 will go towards our Others Campaign. Thank you for your faithfulness and your generosity.

- The Others Campaign from 2018 is projected to have a balance of around \$75,000 at the end of this year. We continue to pay down that debt through our budget and through the generosity of people who continue to give.

-While giving is down by 4% in compared to this time last year it is important to celebrate we have nearly paid off the Windows Campaign. In comparison to previous years, giving has increased 11% since 2021 and almost 14% since 2022.

- On Wednesday, November 6th, the Stewardship Committee will present the 2025 prosed budget. We invite you to join us for conversation at 6pm in the Fellowship Hall.
